

Where the counties got their names

Allen

Colonel John Allen, killed during the War of 1812.

Crawford

Colonel William Crawford, a soldier in the French & Indian War and American Revolution; executed by Indians in 1782.

Hardin

Colonel John Hardin, officer in the Revolution and militia commander on the Ohio frontier; ambushed while acting as peace emissary to the Shawnee.

Hancock

John Hancock, first signer of Declaration of Independence.

Marion

General Francis "The Swamp Fox" Marion, officer in the Revolutionary War.

Mercer

Brigadier General Hugh Mercer, Revolutionary War officer, killed in action.

Paulding

John Paulding, captor of Major André, Revolutionary War.

Putnam

Major General Israel Putnam, served in French & Indian War and Revolutionary War.

Sandusky

Derived from the Wyandot word meaning "water" or "cold water."

Seneca

Named for the Seneca people who were the original inhabitants.

Van Wert

Isaac Van Wart, captor of Major André, Revolutionary War.

Williams

David Williams, captor of Major André, Revolutionary War.

Wood

Eleazer D. Wood, Army officer and engineer for General William Henry Harrison's army, who built Fort Meigs in War of 1812; killed in action.
